# Statement of problem

India has been witnessing a spate of farmers' suicides in the last three decades with the estimated loss of lives pegged at with 5,650 reported during the year 2014 accounting to 4.3% of total suicide victims in the country. Suicides by a large number of farmers during the last two decades have become a regular phenomenon and cannot be brushed aside as events associated with drought or other natural disasters. Indebtedness and family problems are the major causes for farmers' suicides while crop failure, illness and drug /alcoholic addition are other causes. Incidence of suicide is highest in small farmer, followed by marginal and medium farmers. Despite a number of initiatives by Government, the benefits are not reaching the effected farmer resulting in unabated incidence of farmers' suicides. According to the National Sample Survey Office, a large number of farmers across the country are not interested in agriculture. Lakhs of farmers have already been pushed out of agriculture as employment in agriculture is fast shrinking.

#### **Objectives**

- To study and analyze key instrumental factors relating to farmers' suicides.
- To examine efficacy of Government intervention in mitigating instrumental factors.
- To evaluate, with reference to earlier attempts, alternate farming options to effectively mitigate the instrumental factors.
